Low expectations

There were times where I felt pretty hopeless...I held like low expectations for myself. But then I had at least one other person who...did believe in me and they actively encouraged me to pursue education... Even just reassurance that just because you are going through an obstacle doesn't mean that you can't finish the race.

In High School, we did have a careers advisor, but he literally said to me "you will never get into medicine, pick something else". Instead of saying here are the pathways into medicine, it was 'you'll never do it'. I should have been a cook, or like a cleaner, in his opinion.

Young people in care and leaving care

45,000

Children and young people are in care across Australia.



30% of care leavers homeless within 12 months.



Overrepresentation in the youth justice system.



52% of care leavers presented to acute mental health services.



Barriers to postsecondary education.





How do experiences in the out-of-home care system impact on education?



- Low educational Aspirations
- Stigma
- Disrupted Schooling
- Lack of Support
- Learning Challenges
- Leaving school early





Building the Evidence Base: an Australian Model of Support in Higher Education


Raising Expectations research explored:


TAFE and university care experienced students

Student Participation



- Since 2015, there has been an 1800% increase in participation
- From 43 to 835 students participating
- Completions are increasing


